She was awarded the Community Service Award by Black Thread Productions, and cast in a movie called My Brother's Love by William Edwards in 2019, and recognized and dedicated as an elder by She participated in the 2nd Annual Book Signing hosted by the Barbara Mpower Memphis. Gaskins Readers' Choice Book Club. She hosts the My Tru-Sense telecast that airs on Yohits.com inside of Butterflyy's Creative Café' that began August 8, 2018. She also performed a role in a movie called My Brothers' Love that was produced and directed by William Edwards with Black Thread Productions.
